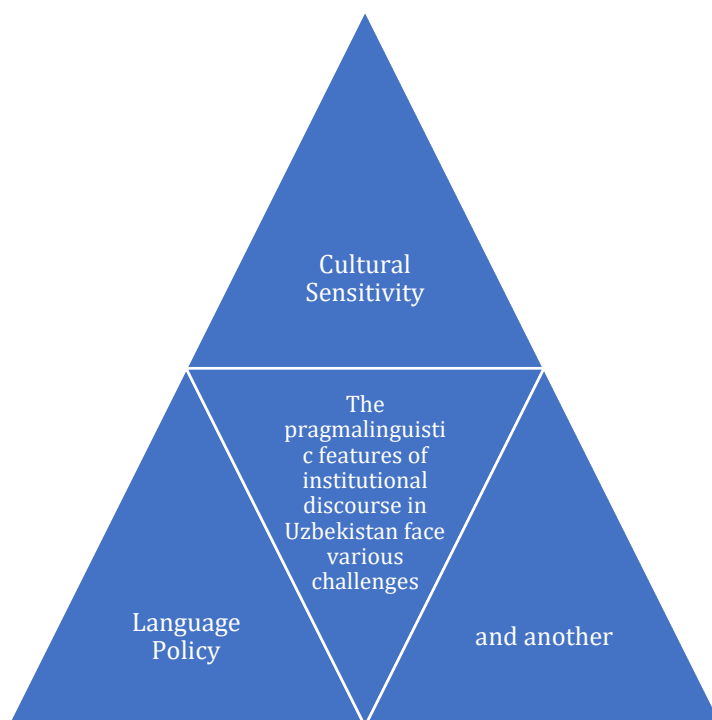


Figure 1. Scheme for pragmalinguistic features of institutional discourse in Uzbekistan face various challenges.
